

The average score is calculated based on the boat's scores. It is not the average based on what other boats have done. See example below

SI

Clauses 19.2 and 19.3 of TCYC SIs gives details on how to apply for average points.

Process to apply for Average Points

Only available if the boat misses a race due to other competing at an approved sailing event or crew doing approved volunteering

Approved by Rear Commodore Sail / Juniors

Approved by TCYC Race Officer

Entered into Finishing Line results program with a code of AVG

How is the average score calculated?

The average points are calculated for all the races in the series except for the races with the code of AVG eg. All except the approved missing races

For the race day the results will come up with a code of DNC. When the progressive score is calculated it will calculate the average scores based on races to date, but the average may change as more race days occur. The final score can not be calculated until the entire series is complete

This is based on the guidance on Redress RRS A10(a)

“points equal to the average, to the nearest tenth of a point (0.05 to be rounded upward), of her points in all the races in the series except the race in question”

Example

For 10 races in the series the boat is scored as follows

After 5 Races

Scores for the boat for the whole series. 1, 2, 3, 1, Avg

Average for non-Average Races = $7/4 = 1.8$

Your score for the Average day will be 1.8.

After 10 races and completion of series. This is the final average score

Scores for the boat for the whole series. 1, 2, 3, 1, Avg, 1, 2, 7, Avg, 1

Average for non-Average Races = $18/8 = 2.3$

Your score for the Average days will be 2.3

Note: This document does not replace the RRS or TCYC SIs. The RRS and TCYC SI will always take priority if the case of differences between them
